- 1. Andi Slade undergoes a significant journey throughout the novel. How does her background as a disbarred attorney influence her actions and decisions? How does her character evolve from the beginning to the end of the story?

- 9. The novel highlights how isolation can both hide evil and foster community. Discuss this paradox as it relates to the trading post and the Alaskan setting.
- 10. The author uses multiple perspectives to tell the story, including brief chapters from the killer's point of view. How did these perspective shifts affect your reading experience?
- 11. True crime podcasts and amateur detective work feature prominently in the novel. How does the book comment on our culture's fascination with true crime?
- 12. The novel blends elements of thriller, mystery, and romance. Which genre elements were most effective? Which would you like to see developed further in future installments?
